Please bring copies of ALL genetic testing results to your provider. We understand this is not always possible, but anything you can bring will help.

If a close relative has been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, consider beginning the path to early pancreatic cancer detection by talking to your physician or genetic counselor.

Early detection and treatment can help increase the 5-year survival rate of pancreatic cancer by nearly 20%. Most are diagnosed too late.
